Visiting Assistant Professor in Special Education

Position Announcement

We are seeking to fill a one-year Visiting Assistant Professor position in the Special Education Program within the Department of Educational Psychology. Assistant professors and recently graduated students with a Ph.D. in special education or allied areas with evidence of a strong teaching record are encouraged to apply; applicants with teacher certification are desired. The successful candidate will join a team of tenure track and clinical faculty who teach undergraduate and graduate level coursework in face-to-face and online formats. Preference will be given to candidates who demonstrate evidence of effective teaching.

Our Special Education Program benefits from being housed in a highly ranked educational psychology department with strong programs in school psychology, counseling psychology, research foundations, bilingual education, and educational technology. Department faculty provide leadership in international programs, including education partnerships in Europe, Central America, and the Middle East.

Responsibilities

1. Teach and mentor graduate and undergraduate students.
2. Field-based supervision of graduate students working on their BCBA certification.
3. Carry a teaching load of eight classes per academic year (4:4). Field-based supervision (of graduate students for BCBA certification and/or undergraduate pre-service student teachers) will be considered part of the teaching load.
4. Support the diversity efforts of the College in its research, teaching, and service mission.

Qualifications (Required)

1. Earned doctorate in Special Education or a closely related field.
2. BCBA certification.
3. Evidence of successful college-level teaching.
4. Experience working with individuals with disabilities.
5. Commitment to teaching and mentoring graduate and undergraduate students.
6. Commitment to collegiality and collaboration.
7. Sensitivity to addressing the needs of students from socially and culturally diverse populations.

Qualifications (Preferred)

1. Special education certification.
2. Expertise in effective instruction, evidence-based practices, or implementation science.
3. BCBA certification and experience providing BCBA supervision.
4. Experience providing behavior analytic services in public or private settings.



5. Experience with online instruction.
6. Commitment to innovation in course delivery and the use of technology in instruction.

Appointment

A one-year (i.e., two academic semesters) Visiting Assistant Professor appointment beginning **September 1, 2017**. Salary and start-up package are competitive and commensurate with rank, qualifications, and teaching experience.
