## I. PROFESSIONAL PHASE \& ADMISSION INTO THE AGGIE EDUCATOR PORTAL

The State of Texas has strict standards for those pursuing Teacher Certification. This includes several outside requirements such as field-based hours and exams you must complete in addition to your required coursework. You will work closely with your academic advisor and faculty to ensure you are meeting all the necessary requirements to be certified. Failure to complete all requirements will result in you not being certified upon graduation.

Students will apply to Professional Phase in the Aggie Educator Portal. Requirements to get into Professional Phase are detailed below. The first day of class following the semester you are admitted to professional phase begins your official start into teacher preparation. Students are not permitted to take any shaded coursework until being admitted into professional phase. All shaded coursework must be completed after admission to professional phase to allow you to meet the clock-field based hours that are required by Texas Education Agency (TEA) to be certified in the State of Texas. Subsequently, if you take any shaded coursework before your official acceptance into the Aggie Educator Preparation portal your ability to be certified will not be possible

Below are the minimum requirements you must meet to be admitted to professional phase:

1. Complete a minimum of 45 hours at Texas A\&M
2. Minimum GPR requirement of 2.75 or higher at Texas A\&M
3. Complete the following courses:

- Core math and science with a grade of "C" or better.
- INST 210 with a grade of " $B$ " or better
- Language proficiency in Spanish


## II. CLINICAL COURSWORK

Once admitted to professional phase you will be allowed to begin your clinical coursework. Clinical semesters are sequenced to ensure that students are completing all the necessary requirements to become certified. Therefore, you must complete your clinical coursework in a minimum of four long semesters. Clinical courses will include field observations meaning you will spend time within an actual classroom in the immediate area (Brazos Valley). You must complete all your degree requirements before you will be permitted to enroll in your Clinical 4 course(s). Clinical 4 is your final semester in which you will student teach in a Partnering School District.

## III. MANDATORY ADVISING

All students will be required to attend mandatory advising. A registration hold is placed on all students account until you attend your advising session. During this advising session students and their advisor will plan out future courses, discuss any resources needed, and ensure proper completion of pre-requisites for admission to the professional phase. Students will be notified when they will be required to attend mandatory advising via their TAMU email.

## IV. CERTIFICATION

All Education degree programs within the Educational Psychology Department are considered certification programs. Students will be required to complete the certification process to graduate. If you do not wish to complete the certification process, you will be required to change your major. All courses in the degree program are designed to prepare students for the certification testing. While certification is mandatory for graduation, all faculty members will ensure you are prepared to be successful in your certification process.

## V. PROGRESS TOWARDS DEGREE

Student Rule 1.5 .1 states, "A student is expected to register for a schedule of courses that follows the program of study for a degree in his or her college. A student who elects not to follow the program of study must obtain approval from his or her academic advisor. A student who fails to obtain approval may be held from registration,
removed from the inappropriate course(s) and/or required to register for a prescribed schedule of courses" Periodically advisors will check to make sure you are taking classes towards your degree. If you are planning to change majors or take prerequisites for professional school, please let your advisor know.
Student Rule 12.1-12.2 - Students must maintain a 2.75 or higher GPA at all times. Those who do not meet the minimum GPA requirements may be placed on academic probation or dismissed from their major.

## VI. UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE PLANNER REQUIREMENT

All students are required by TEC $\$ 51.9685$ to complete an online undergraduate degree plan once every year until graduation. The Undergraduate Degree Planner and a guide are in Howdy on the My Record tab under the Undergraduate Degree Planner channel. This is not a substitute for advising and approval of your Undergraduate Degree Planner does NOT ensure you are meeting all the requirements for graduation. The Degree Planner typically opens for submission on March 1st and is due for Teaching, Learning, and Culture students by August 1st. The Degree Planner is accessible at any time to plan future semesters. NOTE: When students complete 30+ credit hours they will be notified and required to complete and submit their undergraduate degree planner, even if it is their first semester. The degree planner must be approved before you can register for the following semesters courses.

## VII. COURSE FORCING

If a student is entering into one of their clinical coursework semesters the advisors will be able to assist them with registering for their courses. It is imperative that students follow all registration instruction and monitor their emails to ensure they do not miss important registration information. If a course that is needed, falls outside of the department, students will need to contact the school and/or department in which that course is housed to see if they can be forced in as advisors cannot force students into any course that does not fall within our department.

## VIII. DIFFERENTIAL TUITION

Undergraduate students enrolled in the professional phase of teacher preparation programs incur a differential tuition charge of $\$ 300$ in each of the remaining fall and spring semesters. This differential tuition helps support field experiences, supervision, scholarships, and international/urban experiences in culturally diverse settings.

## IX. REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

1. Minimum GPR requirement: 2.5 overall at Texas A\&M.
2. Complete all required coursework with the minimum required grade ( C or better).
3. Apply for graduation and pay the diploma fee the semester you are graduating.
4. Transfer all applicable courses to Texas A\&M by the registrars' deadline.

## X. PRELIMINARY CRIMINAL HISTORY EVALUATION FOR EDUCATION CERTIFICATION CANDIDATES

Texas Education Agency offers a Preliminary Criminal History Evaluation Educator Certification Candidates for a non-refundable fee of $\$ 50.00$. This optional service will allow those individuals who are contemplating obtaining a Texas Teacher Certificate in the future, the opportunity to have a review of an existing criminal history performed by agency staff. The review will be based solely on information provided by the candidate and will result in a non-binding opinion issued by the agency as to whether the candidate would be eligible for Texas Teacher Certification at the time of the evaluation. This process does not preclude a candidate from being required to submit to a national criminal history review as required by statute at the time of application for educator credentials.
