## I. ADMISSION INTO CLINICAL COURSEWORK / EDUCATOR PREPARATION PORTAL

The State of Texas has strict standards for those pursuing Teacher Certification. This includes several outside requirements such as field-based hours and exams you must complete in addition to your required coursework. You will work closely with your academic advisor and faculty to ensure you are meeting all the necessary requirements to be certified. Failure to complete all requirements will result in you not being certified upon graduation.

Students must be admitted to the Educator Preparation Program (EPP) through the Aggie Educator Portal (AEP) before they are permitted to begin their Clinical two (C2) coursework. The minimum requirements for admission into the AEP are detailed below. The first day of class following your admission into Educator Preparation begins your official start into teacher preparation. Students are not permitted to take any shaded coursework until being formally admitted into the Educator Preparation Program. All shaded coursework must be completed after admission to the EPP to allow you to meet the clock hours that are required by Texas Education Agency (TEA) to be certified as a teacher in the State of Texas. Subsequently, if you take any shaded coursework before your official acceptance into the Aggie Educator Preparation Program, your ability to be certified will not be possible.

Below are the minimum requirements you must meet to be admitted to professional phase:

1. Complete a minimum of 45 credit hours that count towards your degree.
2. Minimum GPR requirement of 2.75 or higher at Texas A\&M
3. Complete the following bold courses with a grade of "C" or better:

- 6 Hours of core Mathematics courses
- 6-8 Hours of core Life and Physical Science courses
- ENGL 103 or 104
- TEFB 273
- EPFB 210
- INST 210 with a grade of "B" or better
- Completion of or current enrollment in SPED 302


## II. CLINICAL COURSEWORK AND COURSE SEQUENCING

Once admitted to the AEP you will be allowed to begin your clinical coursework. Clinical semesters are sequenced to ensure that students are completing all the necessary requirements to become certified. You must complete your clinical coursework in a minimum of three long semesters and those three semesters need to be back-to-back. Clinical courses will include field observations meaning you will spend time within an actual classroom in the immediate area (Brazos Valley). You must complete all of your degree requirements before you will be permitted to enroll in your Clinical 3 courses. Clinical 4 is your final semester in which you will student teach in a Partnering School Districts. Prior to Clinical Teaching students must: pass SPED Content Exam, sign up for PPR, and complete and submit TEA requirements. Current districts that we partner with are listed here: https://mysehd.tamu.edu/tlac-clinical-teaching-partnering-school-districts/. Students that are entering clinical coursework are guaranteed a seat in the clinical courses needed to stay on track to graduate within three long semesters. It is imperative that students follow all registration instructions and monitor their emails to ensure they do not miss important registration information.

The special education curriculum is sequenced, meaning you must have a certain amount of credit hours to enroll in certain courses that must be completed in a certain order. Course sequencing rules are outlined below.

- 200 level major course work requires sophomore status to enroll
- SPED 302 is a prerequisite to begin the Clinical courses.
- Most 300/400 level major course work requires junior status to enroll.
- SEFB 315, HIST 471, RDNG 468, SPED 316, and SPED 314 must be taken together.
- SEFB 325, SPED 321, SPED 326, and SPED 325 must be taken together, and can include one additional course from the major coursework portion of the degree.
- SEFB 410, SPED 410, SPED 411, SPED 412, and SPED 418 must be taken together.
- All coursework must be completed prior to beginning the Clinical $\mathbf{3}$ semester.



## III. CERTIFICATION

All Education degree programs within the Teaching, Learning, and Culture department are considered certification programs. Students will be required to complete the certification process to graduate. If you do not wish to complete the certification process, you will be required to change your major. All courses in the degree program are designed to prepare students for teacher educator preparation.

## IV. PROGRESS TOWARD DEGREE

Student Rule 1.5.1 states, "A student is expected to register for a schedule of courses that follows the program of study for a degree in his or her college. A student who elects not to follow the program of study must obtain approval from his or her academic advisor. A student who fails to obtain approval may be held from registration, removed from the inappropriate course(s) and/or required to register for a prescribed schedule of courses" Periodically advisors will check to make sure you are taking classes towards your degree. If you are planning to change majors or take prerequisites for professional school, please let your advisor know.
Student Rule 12.1 - 12.2 - Students must always maintain a 2.75 or higher GPA at all times. Those who do not meet the minimum GPA requirements may be placed on academic probation or dismissed from their major.

## V. UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE PLANNER REQUIREMENT

The Undergraduate Degree Planner (UGDP) is an electronic tool that allows students to create a fouryear layout of degree requirements to map out a tentative graduation timeline. The UGDP is in Howdy and accessible at any time to edit or plan future semesters. Students are encouraged to update their UGDP each semester to prepare for class registration, stay on track with course sequencing, and prepare for academic advising meetings. The UGDP is not a substitute for advising. Completion of your UGDP does NOT ensure you are meeting all the requirements for graduation or that your courses will be available in the semester(s) you plan.

## VI. DIFFERENTIAL TUITION

Undergraduate students enrolled in the professional phase of teacher preparation programs incur a differential tuition charge of $\$ 300$ in each of the remaining fall and spring semesters. This differential tuition helps support field experiences, supervision, scholarships and international/urban experiences in culturally diverse settings.

## VII. REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

1. Minimum GPR requirement: 2.5 overall at Texas A\&M.
2. Complete all required coursework with the minimum required grade ( C or Better).
3. Apply for graduation and pay the diploma fee the semester you are graduating.
4. Transfer all applicable courses to Texas A\&M by the registrars' deadline.
